

Home Delivery RX for Georgia Residents – Update from the Honorable Sharon Cooper – Georgia State House Health and Human Services Committee Chair

I wanted to pass along some information for you to share with your constituents from Good Pill, a nonprofit, home-delivery pharmacy that provides Georgia residents with affordable medication. I just received word that Good Pill is launching a free medication program for those impacted by COVID-19 and need assistance with their medications.

As a community nonprofit pharmacy, Good Pill is launching a free medication program to provide 3 months of medication, at no cost, to new patients who have been impacted by COVID-19. Medication will be delivered to the patient's door.

The Good Pill team is on-hand and available Monday-Friday 10 a.m. – 6 p.m. to help patients register and coordinate prescriptions from doctor's offices or transfer remaining refills from local pharmacies. More about Good Pill

Good Pill is a nonprofit, mail-order pharmacy stocked with donated medications under the Georgia Department of Public Health's Drug Repository Program. Good Pill has over 450 medications available and charges a flat admin fee for prescriptions (\$6 for a 90-day supply of most generics).

The Georgia General Assembly passed House Bill 897 in 2016 to establish regulations for the Donated Drug Repository Program, which allows and encourages licensed health care facilities, like hospitals, pharmacies and long-term care facilities, to donate unopened, unexpired drugs for the purpose of dispensing them to needy individuals.
